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

#### Introduction

- The Collectibles Market has seen a huge uptick in activity, beginning during the pandemic.
- There is ample opportunity for loss/fraud/issues with authenticity in the Collectibles market.
- This program will provide you with valuable insights and tips on how to avoid loss and ensure that Collectibles are what they appear to be.







#### What is a Collectible?

Basically, anything that is a genre that can be collected and has market value.

- Examples include
  - Sports Trading Cards
  - Duck Decoys
  - Designer Sneakers
  - Coins
  - Stamps





### Tip #1: Buy Collectibles Insurance!

- Get protection on your investment in the event of theft, damage, and destruction (subject to policy terms and conditions).
- Regular Homeowners and Auto Cover will likely not be sufficient for valuable collections.
- Specialized Collectibles Coverage provides you with access to resources and quick solutions that other policies will not.
- What Collectibles Insurance will NOT do: Protect you in the event you purchase a fraudulently authenticated/non-authenticated item.



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- It is critical that the collector make certain that the Authentication is accurate, and the item is legitimately what it claims to be.
- For certain collectibles—particularly sports memorabilia—there are trusted authentication experts in the market.
- The Collectibles market is rife with the opportunity for circulation of falsely advertised fakes, largely due to its method of distribution.

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# Tip #3: Careful How You Carry that Cargo

- Transit Losses are common in Collectibles
- In order to avoid transit damage, make sure you are aware of how the item is being packaged, and who it is being shipped with.





## Tip #4: There is Surety in Good Security

- For museums and dealers who display Collectibles and Antiquities, a solid security plan is extremely important.
- Depending on the nature and size of the collection, this could mean security alarms, use of safes/vaults, secure entrances to facilities and more.



# Tip #5: Expect the Unexpected


- Thieves and fraudsters will go beyond what you anticipate.
